

Museum-Collegiate of Covarrubias de San Cosme and San Damian



The 'Tríptico de los Reyes Magos' en polychrome wood, from the end of the fifteenth century, by Gil de Siloé, the painting of 'Cristo Resucitado', by Diego de la Cruz.

Contains sculptures from the fifteenth to eighteenth centuries, ceramics, ornaments and gold and silverware. In the presbytery of the church are the tombs of Fernán González and Doña Urraca.

Buildings

Church Collegiate of San Cosme and San Damian: An old Colegiata (Collegiate Church). The present church dates from 1474, it has three naves and contains a pantheon of illustrious families in the 16th century cloister. There is a 12th-century sepulchre of the Princess Cristina of Norway, the first wife of the Prince Felipe, the son of Fernando III. The Gothic church, one of the best of the so-called Burgos school, contains works of art such as paintings by Alonso de Sedano, Diego de la Cruz and Pedro Berruguete; sculptures by the Egas and Juan Vallejo; jewels by Gonzalo de Calahorra. It has a 16th century cloister and an organ of the 17th century, as well as Baroque altarpieces dating from the 18th century.
