Castile and Leon, and Soria specifically, has one of the biggest truffle cultivation areas in the world with over 600 hectares of holm oaks in mycorrhizal partnerships and truffle production in Soria accounts for about 30% of Spanish production. The properties of the soil and the altitude allow for good ripening and more pronounced taste and aroma.

In recent years, the Regional Government of Castile and Leon has worked hard to promote and raise the profile of the mushroom products cultivated in Castile and Leon in the Spanish and international market, through the "Soria Gastronomica" International Congress of Mycology, the Mushroom-picking Events, and organising the International "Cooking with Truffles" Contest, which is holding its third edition this year.

Featuring an impressive line-up of international chefs, supported by kitchen assistants they have selected from culinary students in their home countries, and a prestigious panel of Spanish and international experts in food, journalists, and Spanish and international chefs.

The event will be held from 3 to 6 March2022 at the Palacio de la Audiencia de Soria Cultural Centre and in 8 restaurants in the city.

#### **MECERREYES CARNIVAL**

Carnival Sunday in Mecerreyes is the setting for the Rooster Run, definitely one of the most unique carnival celebrations in the province of Burgos, which has been declared a Regional Tourist Attraction. The whole village takes part in the celebrations, singing, dancing, and chasing the Rooster. Although there are prominent figures, dressed in strange costumes, who have a more important role. El Gallo (The Rooster): the figure the whole celebration revolves around. A cloth rooster has been used in recent years. El Rey (The King): a child aged around 10, who carries the rooster and stands in the middle of the street so the youths can try to snatch the rooster. Zarramaco: young man dressed in leathers and cowbells, whose job is to defend the rooster from the youths. Danzantes: youngsters who flank the King, they dance to the sound of dulzainas and small drums. Sheriffs and Chief youth: they have the task of making sure the rules are followed, keeping the lines, and so on. The village also has an interesting museum on the Carnival.

Casa Museo Sierra-Pambley, León



The Sierra Pambley House Museum is located on Plaza de Regla, opposite the Cathedral of Leon. It is a 19th century old mansion of a wealthy intellectual from the time. This is one of the finest examples of middle class houses that includes all the innovations of the day. Visitors can explore all the rooms in the house, which have been kept just as they were, as well as learn about the strange story of the family, including the first owner of the house who devoted all his efforts to wooing his niece, who he did not succeed in marrying in the end. Another house museum in the city of Leon is the Perez Mansion, which is nowadays the Museum of Leonese Emigration. The manor house was built by Manuel de Cárdena in 1925 as a family home for the famous carpenter Miguel Pérez Vázquez. The mansion has carved friezes in the shape of the San Marcos choir stalls, as well as other styles such as its art deco decoration and Japaneseinspired painted wallpaper.






#### LA LOMA ARCHAEOLOGICAL SITE

La Loma archaeological site is an important oppidum or fortified city of the type commonly built by the Camaricos, who were part of the Cantabri people, one of the Celtic peoples who inhabited the north of the Iberian Peninsula, which straddles both faces of the Brezo hill. Their territory stretched from the Guardo area to Cervera de Pisuerga, the valley where the River Carrión starts to the north and in the south includes part of the plains that were the border with the Vaccaei. The site covers 16.8 hectares and overlooked the natural travel junction that runs along the foot of the mountain range which follows along Valdavia valley to the south. This central oppidum was occupied by a large indigenous community in the Iron Age between the 6th and 1st centuries BCE. These were societies with a warrior culture who farmed and raised livestock in an economy adapted to the mountainous conditions. The fight against the Romans in the Cantabrian Wars was very bloody as is shown by the almost 3,000 arrow tips that have been found to date. The walls and a recently discovered pre-Roman road are two of the main features. The site is fully signposted. It has information panels that allow visitors to guide themselves around the site. The information is in several languages and there is also a QR code to download the information onto your phone. #### ARMUÑA LENTILS

This variety of lentil with a Protected Geographical Indication is produced in the county of Armuña in the northwest of the province of Salamanca. It seems we have the Romans to thank for introducing the lentil into this area. Their main characteristic is that in their raw form they have a light green, often marbled colour, medium size, and notably flat shape. Once cooked, they create a clear broth, the grains stay whole and the skin, which is so fine as to be almost imperceptible, does not come off. Rich in protein, fibre, iron, and calcium, they have a delicious flavour and a buttery texture on the palate.




#### SANTA MARÍA LA REAL DE NIEVA

Henry III and Catherine of Lancaster decided to found Santa María when in 1392 the Virgin Mary appeared to Pedro Amador, a shepherd, and tasked him with unearthing a figure that was underground ("soterrada" is the Spanish word she used) in a slate quarry near Nieva. That is where the image takes its name of "La Soterraña" from. In the village of Santa María La Real de Nieva, you can find an old Dominican convent with a church, whose cloister and 15th century north door were declared National Monuments in 1920. There are various buildings at this site, including the Collegiate church, built in the Castilian late Gothic style of the time. This church was the temporary resting place of one of Spain's most important queens, Blanche I of Navarre, who died in the village on 1 April 1441. The cloister, in a Romanesque style flowing into Gothic, boasts a wide range of iconography (more than three hundred pieces) with plant motifs and scenes from Late Middle Age society, especially representations of the Castilian agricultural calendar. And lastly, the Hall of the Courts, where Henry IV held a meeting of the Courts of Castile in 1473. They hold a celebration in September, "The Offering of Altar Candles", which was declared a Site of Cultural Interest as a display of tradition.

#### ROMANESQUE IN THE CITY OF SORIA

In the 35 neighbourhoods and parish churches that gave rise to the city of Soria, there are many fine examples of this medieval art that have been preserved. In the River Duero area, you can find one of the most original examples of Spanish Romanesque art: the cloister and church of what was the old San Juan de Duero monastery. A little bit further away, on the promenade to the San Saturio hermitage, stands the San Polo monastery. Climbing towards the city centre you come to the magnificent cloister of the Co-cathedral of San Pedro, as well as the remains of what was the church of San Nicolás and is now a cultural centre. The churches of Santo Domingo and San Juan de Rabanera, with their door and apse respectively, are also highly important works of Spanish Romanesque art that can be found on a journey through the old town.

#### URUEÑA

This medieval village in the province of Valladolid, was granted in 2007 the distinction of book town as the village with the most bookshops in the whole of Spain, with a grand total of 12. It has been a member of the most beautiful villages in Spain association since 2013. This is largely due to its charm as it is almost fully enclosed by a 13th century wall, a castle on the walls, and has cobbled streets. The village has two entrances: the Puerta de la Villa and Puerta del Azogue gates. You can also walk along the ramparts with a view of the beautiful village on the one side and the vast plains of Castile on the other side. It was declared an Historic-Artistic Site in 1975. Also not to be missed are its five museums of art and culture. To round off your visit, head to the outskirts to see the Anunciada Hermitage, the only Lombard Romanesque church in Castile and Leon. The celebrations for its patron saint are held on 25 March and the romeria procession is on 8 September.



#### VILLANUEVA DE VALROJO CARNIVAL

If you come to Villanueva de Valrojo on an afternoon between Sunday and Tuesday in Carnival you will be greeted by the sounds of cowbells and the sight of figures in colourful costumes full of harlequin designs and flowers interwoven with Cowbells. All the costumes and cowbells are left in a house or hay loft. Friends help each other with their costumes, choosing whatever combinations they want, wearing cowbells to run through the streets threatening the locals with their claws, wooden pitchforks, whips, brooms, simple sticks, or with their hands. The Monday afternoon of Carnival is the time to get dressed up and tour the town asking for gifts. Many homes maintain the tradition of giving food: some eggs, chorizo sausage, a bottle of wine, and so on which will be consumed happily in the celebrations later on that evening. Carnival Tuesday: touring the streets of the village with a new and unexpected attraction. Putting on a show about stories in the news in the multipurpose venue in the village, where the night-time dances take place. This is the end of the celebrations with the fleeting appearance of the Devils. As tormented souls, they make an appearance towards the end of the dance. Three Devils wearing cork masks, tinplate and leather appliques, brown and gloomy capes, carrying pitchforks and a cauldron of boiling sulphur silently stalk the event. It marks the end of the celebrations and the start of Lent.
