





Cartulario de Valpuesta, Burgos




A paleographic study developed between 2003 and 2010 by the Instituto Castellano Leonés de la Lengua, under the direction of Professor Jose Manuel Ruiz Asencio and features with the academic support that provides the Real Academia Española (RAE), signals the Cartulario of Valpuesta as the oldest written expression of Spanish, which would date from the 9th century.

This research confirms that the documentation of the Monastery of Burgos of Santa Maria de Valpuesta collects the oldest testimonies of the romance spoken in Castilla, locating thus Castilla y Leon as the Spanish community that has become, by its own right, cradle of the language.

The Cartulario of Valpuesta is a documentary made up of a total of 187 documents written in latin by 34 scribes from this monastery.

The double volume 'Los Becerros Gotico y Galicano de Valpuesta', inspired and edited by the Instituto Castellano Leones de la Lengua, and officially launched at the headquarters of the RAE (Real Academia Española), has become by its own right a solid work on which will underpin studies on the origins of language.







2022 MONUMENTS OPENING PROGRAMME FROM THE 12TH OF JULY TO THE 11TH OF SEPTEMBER

The Ministry of Culture and Tourism is committed to promoting its tourist offerings for the summer with a new Programme for the Opening of Monuments, from tjhe 12th of July to the 11th of September, for the enjoyment of pilgrims and tourists. With this type of action, the Junta de Castilla y León is committed to combining synergies between the artistic heritage and the culture of the Community, through the promotion of tourism.

An initiative that represents a clear commitment from the Ministry to the revitalization of the rural environment through tourism, generating economic activity, influencing the Community's territorial cohesion, and consolidating the tourism sector as a factor of economic development.

This publication compiles, promotes, publicises and facilitates the enjoyment of a broad Opening Programme. It highlights our magnificent historical-artistic heritage with 474 monuments grouped into thematic or geographical programmes. These enable access to and knowledge of these cultural resources and artistic works of the Community of Castilla y León that are not usually open to visitors or have very restrictive conditions for visits.

The opening period is from the 12th of July to the 11th of September 2022, from 11:00 a.m. to 2:00 p.m. and from 5:00 p.m. to 7:45 p.m. Tuesday to Sunday, unless otherwise indicated. With the exception that it will open on Monday 15th of August, and close on Tuesday 16th of August.

This opening programme promoted by the Junta de Castilla y León is carried out in partnership with the Dioceses of Castilla y León through volunteers designated by each parish, who are in charge of opening the temples and providing information on the conditions of the visits. ROMERÍA PROCESSION HONOURING SAN PEDRO DE ALCÁNTARA

This celebration is held every year on 19th October to honour San Pedro, who was born in Alcántara (Cáceres) and whose real name was Juan de Garabito y Vilela. This Franciscan friar became advisor to Santa Teresa and aided her in her reform of the Carmelites. He was ordained at the monastery of San Franciso de los Majarretes, near Valencia de Alcántara, where he took the name of Friar Pedro of Alcántara. The last monastery established by this saint from Extremadura is known as the Santuario de San Pedro de Alcántara. The site lies a distance away from the town of Arenas de San Pedro where there was a shrine to San Andrés del Monto, which Friar Pedro de Alcántara had a small monastery built alongside. He was buried here and was made patron saint of Arenas de San Pedro when he was beatified and the town voted to make 19th October a day of celebration from that point onwards. Thousands of worshippers from both Arenas and the rest of the county make their way to the monastery every year, including those who travel from La Vera and the Oropesa countryside. They come to sing hymns of worship to the Saint and take his statue on a procession around the local area. The pilgrimage to the shrine is made on foot or on garlanded horses. There is also an auction for the honour of carrying the saint. This romería procession is recognised as an event of Tourist Interest of Castilla and León.

DEER RUTTING IN NEILA, BURGOS

The start of autumn in many of the forests in our province comes with a surprise in the guttural and characteristic rutting sound made by male deer as they demonstrate their strength to make themselves more appealing to the females. They also engage in ritual fighting with other males using their antlers. Their preferred locations are forests, where the females go to find food and water. The winning males in these fearsome duels can claim herds of up to 50 females. The Lagunas Glaciares de Neila Natural Park Visitor Centre has information on how to make the very most of this unique spectacle in the Sierra de la Demanda mountains.

CACABELOS (LEÓN) ARCHAEOLOGICAL HERITAGE

The town of Cacabelos, on the Camino de Santiago, is marked by the old Roman road. In the Middle Ages, the town grew considerably, as shown by the church of Santa Maria, the Santuario de las Angustias monastery with the holy image of the Virgen de la Quinta Angustia (Mary of the Fifth Sorrow), and the nearby Carracedo monastery. Life in this town revolves around the Calle de Santa María street, where some of the finest examples of its civic architecture still stand. The bridge over the River Cúa, built in the 16th and 17th centuries, is one of the most spectacular in the whole province. The wineries also record the prosperity of the town and are an inviting way to learn more about the Bierzo Denomination of Origin, which boasts high-quality grape varieties. La Edrada and Castro Ventosa forts are very important in this area. They are both recognised as Sites of Cultural Interest. The Castro Ventosa archaeological site, in Peros, features a magnificent wall from the time of the Later Roman Empire. La Edrada is interesting as the site of the Roman settlement identified as Bergidum Flavium and because it teaches us about the history of El Bierzo. The great wealth of material found in the excavations is on display at the local archaeological museum, MARCA, housed in a late 19th century building which has a magnificent wooden gallery on the top floor. The permanent collection, in addition to the archaeological exhibition, has a room devoted to local traditions and customs.





LAS FALLAS IN PALENCIA? LAS LORAS UNESCO GLOBAL GEOPARK

The Vilaescusa de Ecla Anticline geotrail is one of the selfguided routes that you can follow in the Las Loras UNESCO Global Geopark. On this 2-hour trail you can discover the most typical features and landscapes of this area. Visit a unique viewpoint, where you have a magnificent panoramic view of the Palencia Mountains, stroll through an Iron Age fort, journey through a partially empty anticline fold where you can see the many spectacular faults surrounding this rocky site, or, at rainier times of the year, take in the beautiful Cervigada waterfall. This is a circular walk. It starts and ends in the town of Vilaescusa de Ecla where you can find a board detailing all the information on this geotrail.

El Bosque de la Honfría, Linares De Riofrío, Salamanca

LA HONFRÍA FOREST, LINARES DE RIOFRÍO, SALAMANCA

Next to Linares de Riofrío, in the natural surroundings of Quilamas, stands La Honfría, a lush Mediterranean forest brimming with Pyrenean oaks, strawberry trees, hollies, hundreds of years old sweet chestnut trees, hazels, and heaths. There is a circular, easy 7km trail here that is suitable for all the family. Close to the start of the walk we come to the remains of an old lime factory before heading into a thick forest which offers plenty of shade and a refreshing feeling of humidity. Many picnic areas are to be found along the trail where you can stop and take a break, in addition to numerous natural springs. Scenes from the "El nido" film by Jaime de Armiñán, held to be a masterwork of Spanish cinema, were filmed in these magical spots.



FROMKES GARDEN, SEGOVIA

It is no secret that Segovia is a city that is well worth visiting but we are going to focus on the "Las Canonjías" area in the old town now. This neighbourhood, which is enticing with its Medieval buildings and Romanesque civil architecture, is home to the Maurice Fromkes garden. This Russian-American painter came to Segovia in 1923 and made his home very close to the garden. He was joined by Ignacio Zuloaga and Ramón Gómez de la Serna, who "liked to step out onto his balcony on this square to look over El Parral and the flagstones of Zamarramala". It seems it was a favourite viewpoint for the artists of the time. Indeed, this welcoming garden, finished in 1958, offers spectacular views over the green area of the city. The garden is divided by four paths that all lead to the centre, where there are some stone benches and a fountain, whose flowing water, calls upon us to enjoy this wonderful space with all our senses. Don't miss the "Puerta de La Claustra" (Cloisters' Gate), one of the three gateways into Las Conongías, a neighbourhood where the clergy lived that was closed at night.

GR-86 SORIA IBERIAN TRAIL



Moncayo y Agreda, Soria



The GR-86 is a long-distance trial through a large part of Soria province. It crosses the mountains of the northern edge of the province, turns southwards along the course of the River Duero, and reaches the peaks of the Urbión and Moncayo mountains, which form part of the Iberian System range in Soria. The trail has a total length of 933km, split into 39 stages, 6 detours to local points of interest, 6 variants, and 1 branch, with lengths ranging from 6 to 27km. Along the way it links up with other long-distance trails such as the GR 93 "Rioja Mountain Ranges", GR 90 "Zaragoza Iberian System", and the GR 260 "La Calcenada", as well as a great number of shorter trails and other tourist walking routes in the province. The GR 86, with its variants, branches, and detours, is an excellent path through almost all the natural areas associated with Castilla and León and the European Union in the Province in addition to the wealth of animals, plants, geology, scenery, and traditions here. The great variety of paths and trails that make up this wonderful route and the cycling-friendly conditions of a high percentage of the various stages make this trail a good option for mountain biking.

TORDESILLAS (VALLADOLID) AND ITS MONUMENTS

The historic importance of the town is today reflected in its art and architecture and it has been declared a historic-artistic site. The main square, built in the 16th century, with arcades and buildings with balconies and large windows, retains the traditional architecture of Castile. One of the most important buildings is the Casa del Tratado (House of the Treaty), as it was here that on 7 June 1494 the Treaty of Tordesillas was signed that divided the lands of the New World between Spain and Portugal. The royal Monastery of Santa Clara, built in 1340 by Alfonso XI, was constructed in the Mudejar style and was finished by his son, Pedro 1, who would later gift it to his daughters. They would go on to make it into a convent for Poor Clares nuns. Juana 1 of Castille lived here for the last 46 years of her life and she was buried here before her remains were moved to Granada. A visit to the gothic church is advisable, as is seeing the Arab baths (attached to the building, which is similar in style to the Alhambra in Granada). Make sure to take in the impressive Medieval bridge, the statue of Juana 1, the palace gardens, and the Bellas Vistas viewpoint, as well as the Castilla and León lace museum.

A LEGEND OF THE CATHEDRAL OF ZAMORA


The Cathedral, an icon of the Romanesque in Zamora. It is famous for its Byzantine lantern tower and for housing artwork from the 15th and 16th centuries. Yet, this building also keeps its own legends and mysteries. The petrified head of a thief and even a mummy. Look for the "Cabeza de Piedra" (Stone Head) on the south door. It is said to belong to a thief named Diego de Alvarado, who snuck into the church while it was being built to make off with the construction money. As he tried to leave by a window, the passage narrowed so much that it trapped his head. A stonemason gave orders to separate the body with an axe and leave the head in place as a warning. Over time the head turned to stone and would terrify all those who came to see it.
