









500TH ANNIVERSARY OF ANTONIO DE NEBRIJA 1522 - 2022

Elio Antonio Nebrija was born in Lebrija (Sevilla), which is where he took his pen-name from, in 1441. He studied Humanities at the University of Salamanca and continued his linguistic studies in Bologna, where he came into contact with Italian humanism. He began his teaching career at the University of Salamanca, where he would work continuously for most of his life. After a summons from Cardinal Cisneros, he went to the University of Alcalá to take part in the publishing of the Polyglot Bible. He would later withdraw from the project on account of differences with the group of translators. He spent the final years of his life teaching at the University of Alcalá, where he died in 1522.



This illustrious humanist strove, throughout his life, to recover the High Latin spoken by Cicero and Quintilian, which was being replaced by vulgar language. To do so, he utilised the natural method, based on a good knowledge of Romance language, the language of the people, as the best way to prevent High Latin dying out.

Aranda de Duero has been awarded the title of European Wine City 2020 by RECEVIN, competing with incredible places like Haro, Rueda or La Palma del Condado. Due to the exceptional situation that happened in 2020, it has been extended during the years 2021 and 2022.

In the centre of the extensive fertile plain irrigated by the river Duero, lies the capital of the no less extensive riparian region: Aranda de Duero.

Repopulated in the 9th century, the name of this Castilian city appears for the first time in the Council of Husillos held in 1088. However, it already had very ancient settlements from whose languages it takes its name, Aranda, which means "wide plain", while Duero comes from the river's name. In the 13th century, Sancho IV and Pedro I had already granted the town the privilege of royal status, a status that the people of Aranda never wished to relinquish. Proof of this was demonstrated when, during the reign of Fernando IV, Diego López de Haro wanted to take over the town. The tower of the church of Santa María, built in the 12th century as a defensive feature of the town, bears witness to such courtly intrigues.



Court in the reign of Henry IV, where Archbishop Alfonso Carrillo convened a Council in 1473, held in the church of San Juan. Loyal to the cause of Princess Isabella for the succession to the crown, at the end of the 15th century, beginning of the 16th century, the façade of the church of Santa Maria, on which the royal coats of arms can be seen, among other works, was built.

The church, built in the 15th century in the Gothic style, is home to a 17th century altarpiece and a beautiful Renaissance pulpit, carved by Miguel Espinosa and Juan de Cambray, among other works of art.

Also Gothic, although earlier than Santa María, is the church of San Juan. The façade is adorned with a portal of pointed arches supported by delicate spires, and a later image of Saint John the Baptist. In the chapel of the Calderonas you can see a Plateresque altarpiece, with paintings by an unknown artist from the early 16th century.

TOURISM IDEAS IN CASTILLA Y LEÓN



LA ADRADA CASTLE

This impressive fortress sits atop a hill in the heart of the Tiétar Valley. As you cross over the drawbridge and pass through the door into the fortress you are taken back to the Medieval era. The castle is also home to the Tiétar Valley Historical Interpretation Centre, which shows you how the castle and culture in this valley have changed over time. The centre introduces you to the Vettones, the first settlers of the valley, and you can learn about the arrival of the Roman, the Muslim invasions, the traditional rural world, and other aspects through the models on display. Head to the Tiétar Botanic Garden to round off your visit. In addition to a wealth of native flowers and plants, the garden features species from all over the world that you can view on guided tours.



ROMANESOUE PORTICOS IN THE SIERRA DE LA DEMANDA

The magnificent porticoed galleries that we can find in the Sierra de la Demanda were a feature of the buildings that protected the faithful from the harsh winters in the mountains. The influence of various master craftsmen from the nearby Santo Domingo de Silos monastery can be appreciated in the churches in Vizcaínos, Jaramillo de la Fuente, and Pineda de la Sierra, which date from the late 12th century. The portico in Jaramillo de la Fuente comprises a central door with a semi-circular round arch and two traditional arches to the left and four to the right resting on coupled columns, in Vizcaínos the gallery features two arches and a door, linked by an impost, and the church in Pineda de la Sierra also displays a spectacular open porticoed gallery on the south wall. The town councils used to meet in these outdoor cloisters. There are also other interesting Romanesque churches in Neila and San Millán de Lara, for example.







La Bañeza, León



The city of La Bañeza is located in the south of the province of León, in the county of Valduerna, and is one of the key sites on the Silver Way Route. In terms of heritage, it boasts museums such as the bean museum, which highlights the importance of this crop to the region dating back to the 16th century, and churches such as the 16th century church of Santa María and the church of El Salvador, which is tied to the city's Mozarabic origins. The city also has a large number of Modernist buildings. The best examples would be the Council building, the Pérez Alonso theatre, and the "La Única" Flour Mill, which still contains the original machinery and offers us the opportunity to find out about the history of the city of La Bañeza and the county. Additionally, the "Graffiti Tour" has gone from strength to strength in recent years. In this open-air museum we can discover immensely creative works on small walls and large façades. Turning to food, if there is one dish that stands out in La Bañeza as truly unique it is definitely the "frog legs in salsa bañezana (Bañeza sauce)". Another of the local star products are the imperiales (imperials), small sponge cakes made form almonds, eggs, and sugar.

DREAM OF PRINCES AND PRINCESSES IN OUR CASTLES

We strongly recommend you visit three of our province's fantastic castles.

The 15th century Ampudia Castle where you can visit the parade ground, the museum, pharmacy, and a hall full of highly original old toys. In a journey through the most secret areas of this castle you can discover the dungeons, the throne room, the library, and other hidden corners. Tel (+34) 699 48 45 55

Belmonte de Campos Castle dates back to around the 10-11th centuries. It came into the possession of Inés de Guzmán in the 15th century when more information about it would begin to be recorded. In 1931 it was declared a National Monument. It retains the towering keep that has been recently renovated and refurbished for visits. The top of the keep tower offers stunning views over the Tierra de Campos region. Tel (+34) 642 63 69 07

THE MADRID WAY

Among the numerous Camino de Santiago routes we have in Spain, the Madrid Way is part of those known as the Caminos Tradicionales or Traditional Ways. It links Madrid and Santiago de Compostela in a route through the provinces of Segovia, Valladolid, and links up with the French Way in the province of León. Signage was added to the Way in 1996. It enters the province of Segovia along the Roman road from the Puerto de la Fuenfria mountain pass, passing through Valsain and past the Royal Palace of San Ildefonso, an iconic place to visit. It reaches the city of Segovia, crossing through the centre, before turning towards Zamarramala. Make sure to take in the fantastic views of Segovia from this spot! It continues on towards Valseca, travelling through the villages of Los Huertos, Añe, Pinilla Ambroz, and Santa María la Real de Nieva, where there are marvellous cloisters to visit. The next town on the journey is Nieva, with its white wine "Rueda" Denomination of Origin. After that is Nava de la Asunción, with its colourful walls, then Coca and its fantastic Mudéjar castle and Roman ruins. The final town before crossing into the province of Valladolid is Villeguillo. Remember to carry your Pilgrim's Passport and get it stamped in the different places you stop at and, lastly, as we say here, Buen Camino!

At the western edge of the province of Salamanca, in the Arribes del Duero, lies Hinojosa del Duero. Its location close to the border had an enormous impact on the village during the wars between Spain and Portugal but was also a boost to commercial ties with Portugal. Agriculture and farming in the area sometimes were not enough to live on for the residents, who found smuggling to be a way to earn a living. These illegal trades led to an increase in border posts with border guards known as guardinhas on the Portuguese side and carabineros on the Spanish side. Smuggling was harshly policed but offered rich rewards, so smugglers created new routes on the tortuous trails through the Arribe area to the narrow fords of the Duero or crossed the river with a guindelata hemp rope system, in a basic form of zip-line.

ÓLVEGA AND THE SURROUNDING NATURE

The town of Ólvega, in the east of Soria province, has been a crossroads for different cultures and a strategic location guarding the gateway to Castilla, Aragón, Navarra, and La Rioja. Nestled in the Madero and Moncayo mountains, it boasts spectacular views of the plateau in Castille and the mountains in Soria in the Sistema Ibérico system of mountain ranges. The omnipresent Moncayo stands 2,316 metres tall. Signposted trails through the area allow visitors to enjoy the peacefulness and get in touch with nature. There is the Wind Route, the Fossils Route, the Oak Forests Route, the Moncayo Route, to name just a few. In terms of monuments, the gothic church of Santa Maria la Mayor is worthy of special mention, including its huge Romanesque main altarpiece. It is also home to shrines that watch over all the entrances to the town: San Roque, Soledad, San Marcos, and the Virgen de Olmacedo are all from the late Romanesque period and feature simple lines.

VALLADOLID INTERNATIONAL FESTIVAL OF STREET THEATRE AND ARTS

(TAC)

The 23rd edition of this festival will run from 25 to 29 May in one of the biggest events of its kind in Europe. This event, organised by Valladolid City Council, includes different disciplines such as dance, music, circus acts, and especially theatre. It started out with two aims. Firstly, to promote new artists, who perform outside the walls of theatres, and secondly to give the city a different cultural experience with which to start spring. Over the event, companies from all over the world turn the streets of the city of Valladolid into one big show. The performances, aimed at all ages and tastes, are held in different areas, such as the Campo Grande park, calle (street) Santiago, and on the pavements in quiet spots, as well as many other places. Most performances are free, but some of them do charge, generally between ≤ 1.50 up to ≤ 20 . For five days, the streets of Valladolid became a stage for this art, five days to soak up the show, and discover the other attractions the city has to offer.

CUISINE IN ALISTE

Aliste is one of the most agricultural counties in the province of Zamora and it is dotted with oaks, holm oaks, and scrubland. Together with neighbouring Tábara and Alba, it is bordered by the Sierra de la Culebra, the river Duero, Portugal, and the Esla reservoir. The county of Aliste is known mostly for the meat it produces. This includes the Ternera de Aliste Protected Geographical Indication (PGI) for veal. Limited production with a focus on highly traditional, meticulous processes is the hallmark of this large-scale rural development project. It is unquestionably some of the finest beef in Spain. A smooth, delicate flavour, a soft and juicy texture, a light aroma, and its distinctive pink colour make this veal a real delicacy. Three areas are at the forefront when it comes to savouring this delicacy. These are San Vitero, Grisuela, and Rabanales, in whose restaurants you can also sample mollejas, another typical dish from the county. Other products to try are cheeses (such as Fariza de Sayago cheese and San Martín de Tábara goat's cheese), chorizo sausage, sweets (the borracho (drunken) sponges from Alcañices, Rabanales cake), the unique dark heather honey, chestnuts, and wine from the Sierra de la Culebra.
