

# Riaño and Mampodre Mountain Regional Park



The Picos de Europa are the largest limestone formation in Atlantic Europe with important karst processes, chasms that reach more than 1,000 m and very clear glacial erosion.

Abrupt territory and steep slopes, in its streams and forests, in its meadows and cliffs, beings that are already forgotten in many places and unique cultural patterns take refuge and survive.

Life in the present, part of our past and a reference for the future. But here there is much more than landscape, there are centuries of history written in the villages, in the valleys, in the churches, in the cabins of the ports and on their roads but also in its people, some settlers who, over the centuries, they have made their life compatible with the conservation of nature. ### Enviromental Areas

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**Fauna:** The bear and capercaillie are the most representative species. Wolves, chamois, European badgers, otters, Bonelli's Eagle, Eurasian eagle-owl, Egyptian vulture and vulture are some of its inhabitants.

**Relief:** A peculiar geological nature formed by a compact mass of limestone, broken and spectacular modeling. Its peculiar landscape is due to two types of erosion: glacier and karst.

**Vegetation:** The beech forms its main wooded mass. There are European holly, yew, chestnut, oak and birch also. Pinar de Lillo is a very interesting place but with a restricted access.
