Paintings from the Escuela Castellana, sixteenth century. In the church there are three canvasses by Goya and three by Bayeu. Collections of sacred ornaments and small clothed statues. Important collection of carvings of the Child Jesus.

Buildings

Monastery of San Joaquin and Santa Ana: Felipe V ordered its construction in the 18th century although Carlos III decided to rebuild it along Sabattini lines, opened in 1787. Neo-classic building with circular church. The church has works of art on Neo-classic altars by Ramon Bayeu and Francisco de Goya (those in the Epistle) in his Neo-classic period in addition; there is also a patio, a choir, a cloister and the Museo de Gregorio Fernández y Pedro de Mena.
